

Hellenic Army M107 & M110A2 SPGs in Cyprus

A small number of Hellenic Army M107 175 mm self-propelled guns served for a short period on Cyprus and these carried a unique camouflage schemes similar to that used by the Greek Cypriot National Guard. Later the Hellenic army converted its few M107 SPGs to the M110A2 configuration. This type also served in Cyprus. Four different vehicles may be built using the markings included in this set.

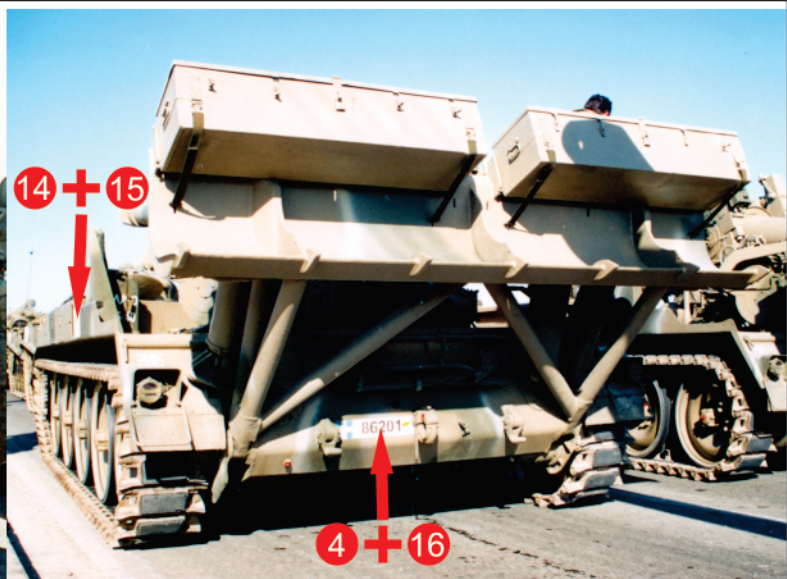
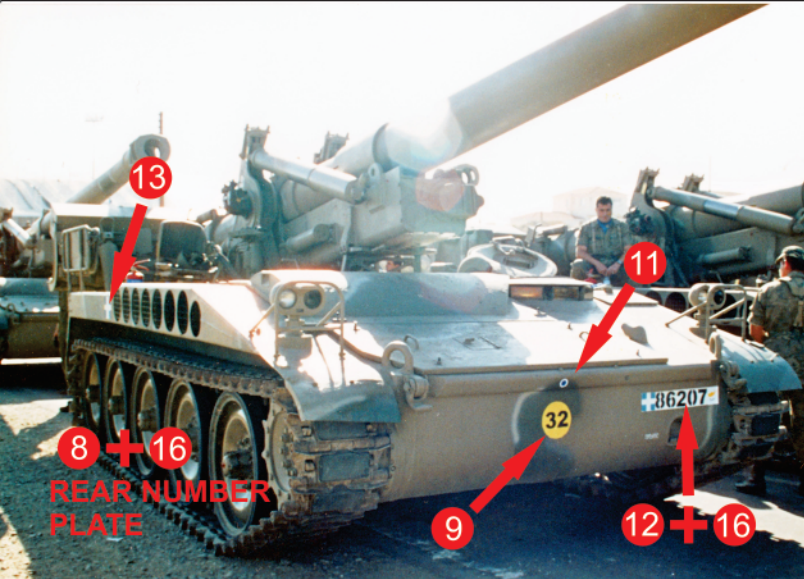

In 2002 the National Guard had adopted a four colour camouflage scheme similar to the MERDC pattern. The colours used were Green (close to FS34087), Sand (close to FS 30372), Mid Grey (close to FS 36293) and Light Grey (close to FS 37722).

The earlier camouflage scheme in use from 1983 to 2003 consisted of three colours Sand (close to FS 33695), Brown (close to FS 30252), and Green (close to FS 34098).
